Medical Terminology I

Course Description:

This course equips members of the health care professions with a working knowledge of medical vocabulary, emphasizing definitions, spelling, and pronunciation as it relates to the body.

Student Learning Objectives:

1. Spell, pronounce, define, identify word parts, and correctly use medical terms.
2. Construct an acceptable and correctly spelled medical term, given the definition.
3. Provide a medically acceptable abbreviation of phrases, names, or labels.
4. Supply the correct medical term to properly complete a statement.
5. Correctly provide a plural and/or singular form of a given medical term.
6. Construct correctly spelled medical terms from word parts and definitions.
7. Identify body systems/cavities and the specific organs within.
8. Identify and describe medical specialties.

Test Conditions:

Each student will have 90 minutes to take the exam. All materials needed will be provided at the testing center.

Test Norm Levels:

In order to receive credit, the student must score an 80% or higher on the challenge examination. The exam can only be taken one time.
