The Grand Rapids Community College (GRCC) Grants and Resource Development Department provides leadership, support, coordination and development of all grant activities in association with faculty, staff and students in order to advance the Mission, Vision, and Strategic Ends of the college.

The Grants and Resource Development Department is staffed by Judith Larsen, Director, Lisa Dopke, Associate Director, and Delicia Wilondja, Educational Support Personnel. The department reports to the Provost/ Executive Vice President for Academic & Student Affairs, Gilda Gely, Ph.D.

This Annual Report reflects the accomplishments of the GRCC Grants Department during FY 2013, which covers the period from July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013.

# **Grant Awards: 2012-2013**


In FY 2013, **\$6,317,019** in grant revenues were awarded to GRCC. A breakdown of grants awarded as of 06/30/13 shows support for both new and existing programs:

- \$3,258,022 in grant funding was received for 15 new grants.
- \$3,058,997 was received for the continuation or modification of 10 existing grants.

# **Total Grant Awards 2006-2013**

A total of \$45,206,971 in grant funding has been received by GRCC in the last seven years from federal, state, and local government entities, as well as from public and private foundations and corporate and professional organizations.



# **National Benchmarks**

Despite state and federal grant funding cuts in the last several years, the GRCC Grants Department continues to exceed national benchmarks for funding success rates. The 2010-2011 National Grants Survey conducted by the Clements Group of 133 community/ technical colleges in 34 states and 11 state-wide community college systems provides comparative benchmark data as, does the 2009 American Association of Grant Professionals Survey of 583 grant professionals in the U.S.

# **Notable Grant Awards in FY 2013**

### **Academic Outreach: Lakeshore Campus and Regional Centers**

• A total of \$1,625,959 was awarded by the Ottawa County Michigan Works! Agency for the Workforce Investment Act and Trade Assistance Act (TAA) OneStop Services programs.

#### **Student Success and Retention**

- \$387,564 in grant funds from the U.S. Department of Education, Student Support Services program was provided for support services to first generation, low income students.
- \$133,500 was awarded from the State of Michigan Workforce Development Agency, Office of Adult Education: WIA Core Programs for GED, English as a Second Language and Adult Basic Education at the GRCC Learning Corners.

#### **Arts and Sciences**

- A grant in the amount of \$166,214 was provided by the National Science Foundation, Transforming Undergraduate Education in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics program for the acquisition of a new gas chromatography-mass spectrometry (GC-MS) instrument, and to provide learning opportunities for GRCC faculty and high school teachers and their students.
- \$217,600 in grant funds were awarded by the Michigan Department of Education, Great Start School Readiness program for early childhood programs of educational excellence. This program is conducted in partnership with the Kent Intermediate School District and Grand Rapids Public Schools.

# **Instructional Support and Interdisciplinary Studies**

A Muslim Journeys Bookshelf was awarded to GRCC's Library and Learning Commons by the
National Endowment for the Humanities. The bookshelf included a set of 25 hardcover books,
a collection of short videos on Islamic arts (on DVD), two films with public performance rights,
a one-year subscription to Oxford Islamic Studies Online, and supplementary materials for
program promotion that included bookplates, bookmarks, and posters.

## **Student Affairs**


AT&T awarded \$20,000 to GRCC's Upward Bound (UB) program to support UB Success
Clubs, designed to provide structured leadership development activities and career
exploration for at-risk high school students. An AmeriCorps\*VISTA member, appointed by
the Michigan Nonprofit Association, will assist UB staff in coordinating the Success Clubs.

## **Workforce Development**

- The Area Community Services Employment and Training Council provided grants for the following programs: \$233,877 for JET Training Clearinghouse and \$2,684,883 for Employment Service Labor Exchange Services in Kent and Allegan Counties.
- \$75,000 was awarded by the Michigan Center for Student Success, Pathways to Credentials program for further development of career pathway programs.
- A grant in the amount of \$700,000 was provided by the W. K. Kellogg Foundation to expand the *Pathways to Prosperity* program which provides resources to promote postsecondary achievement leading to gainful employment.

# **Grant Awards to College Departments**

Grant awards to college departments supported a range of academic and student support programs, as well as local and regional workforce development. Programming was supported in the following college departments: Arts and Sciences (2.6%), Student Success and Retention (8.2%), Student Affairs (.3%), Workforce Development (59.4%), Academic Outreach: Lakeshore Campus and Regional Centers (25.7%), GRCC Foundation (3.2%), and Equity and Woodrick Diversity Learning Center (.5%).





As a community college, GRCC is uniquely committed to enriching its community through grant-supported educational and civic programming that enhances the quality of life for West Michigan residents. In FY 2013, the National Endowment for the Humanities selected GRCC's Library & **Learning Commons** to receive a Muslim Journeys Bookshelf as part of their Bridging Cultures initiative. This award provided books, films, and other resources to inform the public about Muslim culture through the delivery of cross-college collaborative offerings that seek to engage student and community audiences in reflection and conversation.

GRCC seeks grants for programs that provide all learners with access to a variety of educational opportunities to prepare them for success in the local and regional workforce. As the result of a generous grant from the W. K. Kellogg Foundation, for example, GRCC will expand its successful Pathways to *Prosperity* program that seeks to improve the economic mobility of vulnerable families by promoting postsecondary achievement leading to gainful employment.

# Total Grants Received by Funding Source

Grant funds were allocated from a variety of funding sources: Federal (8.8%), State (2.1%), County (72.6%), Corporate and Professional Entities (1.8%), and Public or Private Foundations (14.7%).


# **GRCC Department Highlights**

## **Physical Sciences: Chemistry**









In FY 2013, GRCC's Chemistry Department was awarded its first National Science Foundation grant through the Transforming Undergraduate Education in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics program. The project provided funds for the purchase of a gas chromatography-mass spectrometry (GC-MS) instrument to complete GRCC's state-of-the-art laboratory, and supported professional development for GRCC faculty and local high school science teachers. Two forensic chemistry summer camps were conducted for high school students to help them understand the GC-MS instrument and recognize the practical connections between science and technology. The camps provided students the opportunity to use analytical instrumentation in an inquiry-based forensic chemistry experience.

In FY 2013, the GRCC Foundation allocated \$60,000 for professional development to support the participation of faculty and staff in a variety of learning opportunities. Professional development grants are administered by the Grants and Resource Development Department through the Instructional Improvement & Professional Development (IIPD) and Support Staff Professional Development (SSPD) programs. Grant recipients and their respective activities are listed below.

## Instructional Improvement & Professional Development (IIPD) Grants

The purpose of the IIPD Grant program is to support faculty professional development to ensure continued growth, develop new avenues of instruction and curriculum, and to enhance the professional lives of faculty for increased student learning, achievement and success.
