8.28 Mandatory Student Orientation

Decision

On March 15th, 2022 the ACG membership voted to endorse the 8.28 policy with the following changes:

- Remove GPA requirement to participate in online orientation
 - Allowing students to partake in orientation format that best suits their needs
 - Convenient for students with other responsibilities
 - More accessible option (e.g. long distance students, flexible, at own pace)
 - Anxiety for face to face sessions
 - Reconnect Scholarship
- All students new to GRCC who are seeking a degree or certificate are required to attend a mandatory New Student (Orientation) Academic and Financial Advising session prior to enrollment in courses. Excluded from this policy are guest, personal interest, dual enrollment, early college, and students who transfer in 12 credits taken at another college. Students can select the orientation format that best fits their needs.

Policy was approved by AGC in April 2013; Effective for Fall 2016 start. There has been overwhelming support for policy changes. GRCC needed to follow the trends and make sure our policy was equitable.

Mandatory Orientation is common practice at nearly all community colleges and universities (Koch and Gardner 2014), "comprehensive orientation... establishes the skills necessary for success, and promotes self-efficacy/autonomy" (Robichaud, 2016)

Mandatory Orientation supports student success and readiness. It helps set college student expectations.
