

Grand Rapids Community College Motorcycle Rider Education Program RIDERCOACH APPLICATION – 2024

TRAINING DATES:

<u>RiderCoach Preparation 1-</u> April 4, 5, 6, 7 and 11, 12, 13, 14-Caledonia, MI – Application deadline is March 4, 2024

Or

<u>RiderCoach Preparation 2</u>- July 25, 26, 27, 28 and August 1, 2, 3, 4 – Caledonia, MI – Application deadline is June 25, 2024

Total 8 days-8:00am to 5:00pm **+ Online meetings** scheduled on Thursday Weeknights and weekends prior to your onsite class dates In March and July. (Bookwork and homework prior to class) (Scheduled when you sign up for class and verify your availability)

About the training

Successful completion of this training will result in a RiderCoach Certification through the Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF). The MSF is a nationally recognized program that has provided the curriculum followed by all motorcycle safety training providers in the State of Michigan.

This training is 64-88 hours in length. We are limited to 8 hours a day. You will learn to teach the MSF's Basic Rider Course (BRC) using adult learning principles. The course will begin with a compressive pre-course assignment which MUST be completed prior to the first IN PERSON class meeting. The RiderCoach Trainers will lead instruction and assignments. Once the material has been covered, you will practice teaching in the classroom and on the range exercises with your fellow RiderCoach Candidates. At the end of the training, you will be student-teaching a BRC class with novice students.

RiderCoach Requirements

- To become a certified RiderCoach, you must: Be 18 years or older.
- Have a commitment from a current sponsor to hire you if you are accepted and successful.
- Possess a valid driver's license, including a motorcycle endorsement to operate a motorcycle for a minimum of one (1) year.
- Have a personal driving record with not more than six (6) points for moving violations during the 12 consecutive months applying for approval as a RiderCoach.
- Successfully complete a Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF) RiderCoach Preparation Course.
- Candidates *must be physically capable of standing on pavement in various weather conditions for extended periods of time*. This includes rain, snow, direct sun and extreme heat/cold. (Sometimes all in the same class)

Other aspects taken into consideration:

- The candidate is an active motorcyclist with considerable street riding miles each year.
- The candidate is <u>committed to all aspects of motorcycle rider and safety education</u> and the MSF RiderCoach Rules of Professional Conduct.
- The candidate shows evidence of strong presentation skills.
- The candidate has committed to the sponsoring program with a willingness to work a minimum of four (4) classes per season for a minimum of three years, meets the needs of the recommending sponsor and represents the program in a courteous and professional manner.

Additional licensing requirements may be necessary for coaches teaching in the private sector.



Grand Rapids Community College Motorcycle Rider Education Program RIDERCOACH APPLICATION – 2024 ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Acceptance

To apply, you must have had successful completion of the MSF BasicRidercourse within one year of

application, Have the application signed by the sponsor that will hire you if you are successful, fill out the RiderCoach Preparation application form (this document) and return it to the contact person at the training provider you will be working for and have them submit it to the person listed at the end of this application. Once received, you will be contacted for a brief phone interview. Participants for the Rider Coach Preparation Course are determined by **Selective Admission**. If you are accepted into the program, you will receive written notification approximately six weeks prior to the start of the training.

If you are selected and accept this opportunity:

- You will be asked to register and pay a \$75 course fee.
- Upon the <u>receipt of your course fee</u>, you will be provided with the course materials and pre-course assignments which must be completed prior to the first in person class.
- We <u>highly-recommend</u> you volunteer to assist in a Motorcycle Safety Foundation BRC or RRC class prior to starting the RiderCoach Prep program. This opportunity will allow you to work alongside certified RiderCoaches to gain a better understanding of the class flow and physical demands of the position.
- Contact your sponsor program manager for opportunities. Class schedules are available upon request.

Preparation

You will receive pre-course assignments along with your RiderCoach Guide prior to the start of your training - these assignments <u>must be completed before you arrive for your first in-class session</u>. This is an intensive training that covers a lot of material in a short period of time-it is both physically and mentally demanding. Please be prepared to ride training motorcycle every day (provided for training) and study in your *off-class* hours.

Required riding gear includes: a 3/4 or full-face helmet (DOT approved); eye protection; boots that cover your ankle; long pants; long-sleeved shirt or jacket; and full-fingered gloves. (Rain or snow gear may also be desirable in Michigan.)

Successful Completion

To successfully complete the training, you must:

- Attend 100% of the time. Before applying, please check your personal calendar and verify you are available to attend all dates and times.
- Complete and submit all homework assignments prior to class beginning on the first day.
- Pass a pre-test over the provided materials during the first in person class session.
- You will be evaluated using objective criteria. Two (2) overall unsatisfactory scores will constitute dismissal from the program.
- Take a written final exam (50 multiple choice questions) and score 80% or better.

Evaluations

- Pre-test over provided material.
- BRC Skills Test
- Peer Teaching
- Student Teaching
- Written Assignments/Quizzes
- Written Final Exam

Minimum Skill Test Score Needed to Pass

- -8 points per Part 1 (No more than -12 points total)
- 1 overall Unsatisfactory (the 2nd constitutes dismissal) while student teaching.
- Satisfactory completion and submission of assignments
- 80% on the RCP End of Course Knowledge Evaluation
