Goals of CAP 3.2.1. Continued

- Collect feedback on transfer events from students and our four year partner institutions to assess
- Evaluate and enhance/expand our transfer resources including: transfer website and addition of short videos to direct students, faculty and staff to transfer resources
- Change from Counseling & Career Center to Academic Advising & Transfer Center
- Continue collaborations with four year partners through: liaisons, task forces, conference presentations, joint workshops, open house participation, transfer guides
- Faculty Advising Training



CAP 3.2.1. Lead Measures

- Welcome Week Transfer Day: 9 academic departments, 18 transfer schools, 500 students attended
- Transfer Fair – 34 schools planning to attend
- CLS 100 Presentations – 35 presentations, 875 students
- Faculty Training – first one held 10/10/16
- Transfer Workshops – 19 workshops offered so far
- Still need to seek feedback from: students, faculty, four year partners on events and trainings
